NOTES CONCERNING HOME PRESERVES

- Lemon Curd – Must have cellophane and wax disc.**
- Jam – Preferable to have wax disc and cellophane. New screw tops acceptable**
- Chutney – Screw plastic lid with plastic coating – New screw tops must be put on whilst preserve is HOT. Should be made at least 6 months prior to exhibiting.**

- Class 4. Jar of lemon curd, dated.
- Class 5, Jar of fruit jelly, dated
- Class 6. Jar of soft fruit jam, dated
- Class 7. Jar of stone fruit jam, dated
- Class 8. Jar of Marmalade, dated

- Class 10 Small Bottle of Limoncello to the following recipe –

| 5 unwaxed lemons | 1 litre bottle Vodka |
| 750g caster sugar | 700ml boiling water |
- Pare the zest from all the lemons, taking care not to include any white pith. Put the zest in a large clean jar and pour over the vodka. Cover with a tightly fitting lid and leave for a week. Shaking the jar each day
- Put the sugar in a heatproof bowl and pour over the boiling water, stirring until the sugar dissolved. Add the vodka and zest and leave for a further week. Shaking the jar regularly.
- Strain into bottles adding a few strips of lemon to each bottle
