PLOUGHING COMPETITION

Each competitor forward in Classes 1P-12P inc. will receive
a VOUCHER for LUNCH

- Age (where relevant) is calculated to the 1st October in the year of the Match. **Competitors under 25 years please state your age if under 25 years on 01/10/2022 on the entry form. Thank you.**
- All Competitors, except in open classes, shall reside within a radius of twelve miles from the Brailsford Post Office.
- No competitor, exhibitor, or other person, except Stewards, shall be allowed near the Judges, whilst judging takes place. Any person interfering with or assisting any competitor or exhibitor during the competition shall cause disqualification of the Competitor concerned.
- The Judge's decision shall be final.
- A competitor who has been disqualified shall not be eligible for any prizes.
- **One Tractor, one competitor.**
- **There will be no tractor sharing.**
- **No passengers on any tractor on the match site.**
- **No GPS allowed, instant disqualification.**

IMPORTANT NOTICE

It is the responsibility of all competitors to have their own Public Liability Insurance and to comply with all Health and Safety Regulations in force at the time of the Match. Competitors must have with them their own copy certificate of Insurance and must be able to produce it on the match day if required.

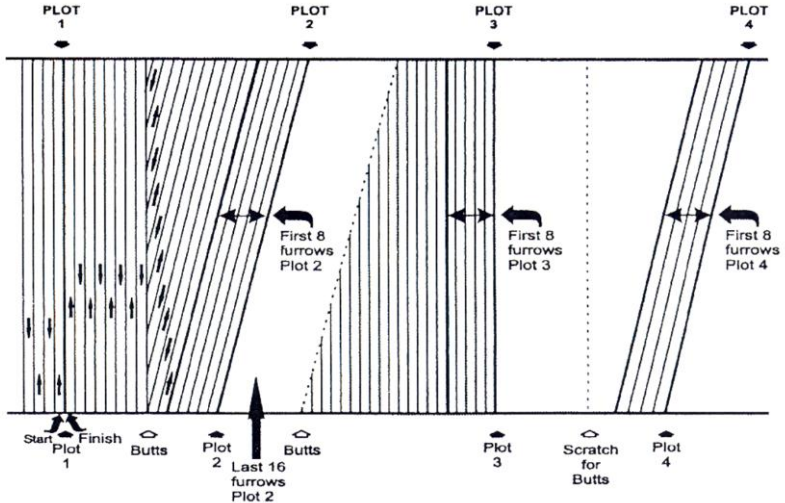
Classes 5P, 6P & 12P will be scored as One Way points less butts.

ALL ONE-WAYS TO MAKE SINGLE SPLIT

THE SOCIETY IS AFFILIATED TO THE SOCIETY OF PLOUGHMEN, and the judging of these Classes will be made on the NATIONAL POINTS SYSTEM. Where practical judging will be carried out from both ends, as practised by the Society of Ploughmen.

ENTRIES FOR TRACTORS & PLOUGHS TO COMPLY WITH NATIONAL RULES 2022

System for Reversible Ploughing



TIMES of STARTING: -	Horses	9.00am
	Tractors	9.00am
DEPTH of Ploughing: -	Horse class	5 inches
	Tractor class	7 inches

This may be varied on the day according to ground conditions at the discretion of the judges.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

(MARQUEE) ON ARRIVAL TO COLLECT NUMBER AND LUNCH TICKET.**

**TIMES OF STARTING and FINISHING WILL BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO
Tractor Ploughing Competitors must have finished three rounds by 10.30am.**

ALL CLASSES TO FINISH AT 1.00pm

All ploughing is to be completed in the time allowed, although further time may be allowed with the Chief Steward's permission to compensate for time lost during the judging of opening splits.

Rig setting, trying out of ploughs etc., on headland or spare pieces of ground will NOT be allowed. The Stewards have power to disqualify any competitor breaking this rule.

All opening splits where applicable must be left open for inspection by the Judges/Stewards, who will then give permission to continue.

Competitors after having completed their crown, i.e. 6-8 furrows either side of the opening split, will then plough to the higher number, with one-way ploughs to use alternate bodies.

HORSE PLOUGHING

CLASS 1P: HORSES – OPEN

Competitors shall plough in the straightest and best manner to a depth of not less than 5 inches using a pair of horses.

A leader will be allowed in this Class and competitors may finish their furrow with one horse if they wish.

HORSE PLOUGHING

This class has been kindly sponsored by Talbot Turf Supplies, Hilton.

The winner will receive, and hold for one year, **THE FRED WOOD PERPETUAL MEMORIAL TROPHY** and **THE PROP FARM TROPHY** generously donated by Grange Farm, Elmton, Cresswell, Derbyshire.

BEST PAIR OF HORSES

This class has been kindly sponsored by Livesey Brothers,
Lowerfields Mushroom Farm.

The winner will receive, and hold for one year, **THE PERPETUAL CHALLENGE CUP** presented by Mrs T White.

THE H W SALT MEMORIAL TROPHY, to be held for one year, will be presented to the Exhibitor with the Best Mare or Pair of Mares.

THE BEST KEPT AND CLEANEST TACKLE

The winner will receive, and hold for one year, **THE CHALLENGE CUP** presented by R Hull, Esq.

THE HENRY NAYLOR TROPHY, to be held for one year, will be presented to the person gaining the most points in all sections of Class 1P.

Each pair of horses competing and deemed to have completed their work according to the rules and to the satisfaction of the Stewards will receive a contribution towards their expenses amounting to £150.00.

TRACTOR PLOUGHING

THE ALAN SMITH (GARAGES) LTD. PERPETUAL TROPHY will be held for one year by the Best Junior (under 21) in Classes 2P, 3P, 7P, 8P, 9P & 10P.

CLASS 2P: OPEN (World Style)

The winner will hold for one year, **THE APPLETON FUEL SERVICE TROPHY**.

CLASS 3P: OPEN (High Cut)

Two or three furrow plough with or without match fittings.

The winner will receive, and hold for one year, **THE MACKWORTH HOUSE PERPETUAL TROPHY**, presented by G S Clark-Maxwell, Esq.

CLASS 4P: SENIOR OPEN (European Style, One-Way)

Two - three furrow one-way plough, as in the National System.

The winner will hold for one year **THE PETER DAVIS (TRACTORS) LTD TROPHY**.

NOTES TO CLASSES 5P, 6P & 12P

ONE-WAY PLOUGHING (Traditional System).

THESE CLASSES ARE OPEN TO COMPETITORS OF ANY AGE.

ANY JUNIOR (i.e. not having attained their 21st birthday on 1st October 2022) is eligible to plough in Classes 5P & 6P. Prize Monies donated by John Shepherd.

The highest placed junior in each class will receive £6.00 and the next highest placed will receive £4.00 in addition to any prize money they receive if placed.

The highest placed Junior in each class residing within 12 miles of Brailsford Post Office will receive, and hold for one year, **THE BIRCH HOUSE PERPETUAL CHALLENGE CUP** presented by R T Goodall, Esq. (Anyone winning **THE BIRCH HOUSE PERPETUAL CHALLENGE CUP** three times will receive a tankard to keep kindly presented by R T Goodall, Esq.) and retain **THE T R & J H YATES MEMORIAL PRIZE** as directed by the late Miss G M Yates' annuity.

CLASS 5P: OPEN (2 or 3 furrow) ONE-WAY, TRADITIONAL

Ploughing to be with a two or three furrow Semi-Digger Reversible Plough, as manufactured and not adapted, with no attachments other than standard flat tail piece and fitted with skimmers, which must be used.

The winner will receive, and hold for one year, **THE J W ATKIN MEMORIAL TROPHY** kindly presented by the family in memory of the late Mr Atkin.

CLASS 6P: OPEN (4 or more furrows) ONE-WAY, TRADITIONAL
Ploughing to be with a 4 or more furrow reversible plough.

The winner will receive, and hold for one year, **THE FUEL OIL SUPPLY CO. LTD. PERPETUAL TROPHY.**

CLASS 7P: OPEN NATIONAL QUALIFIER FERGUSON TE20 TRACTOR AND FERGUSON PLOUGH

This Class is a qualifier for the National Ploughing Competition and is to be ploughed with a Genuine Ferguson TE20 Tractor and Ferguson Plough. Adjustable Top Links may be used, but NOT Quick Entry, and no further modifications.

Plough: any make of trailing plough.

CLASS 9P: VINTAGE TRACTOR - MOUNTED PLOUGHS

Tractor: the model to have been in production before 31st December 1959 and to be as manufactured, approved manufacturer's diesel engine conversions allowed. A list of eligible tractors is available.

Plough: any make of mounted plough, in production before 31st December 1959.

CLASS 10P: CLASSIC VINTAGE TRACTOR – TRAILER OR MOUNTED PLOUGHS

This Class is for those who are ineligible for classes 8P & 9P.

The winner will receive, and hold for one year, **THE GEORGE BRIDDON MEMORIAL TROPHY.**

CLASS 11P: CLASSIC REVERSIBLE

Classic Reversible - Any make of tractor pre Q cab, approx. 1976 and any make of reversible plough as manufactured before December 1976.

CLASS 12P – HORTICULTURAL TRACTOR PLOUGHING (FOR HORTICULTURAL TRACTORS & PLOUGHS)

Minimum depth of 12cm (opening split optional).

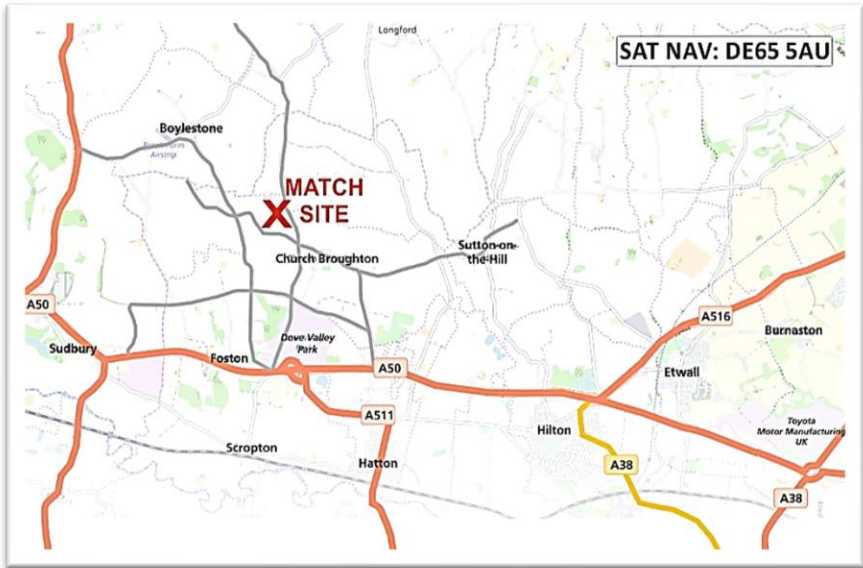
