- Age (where relevant) is calculated to the 1st October in the year of the Match. **Competitors under 25 years please state your age if under 25 years on 01/10/2019 on the entry form. Thank you.**
- All Competitors, except in open classes, shall reside within a radius of twelve miles from the Brailsford Post Office.
- No competitor, exhibitor, or other person, except Stewards, shall be allowed near the Judges, whilst judging takes place. Any person interfering with or assisting any competitor or exhibitor during the competition shall cause disqualification of the Competitor concerned.
- The Judge's decision shall be final.
- A competitor who has been disqualified shall not be eligible for any prizes.
- **One tractor, one competitor.**
- **There will be no tractor sharing.**
- **No passengers on any tractor on the match site.**

IMPORTANT NOTICE

It is the responsibility of all competitors to have their own Public Liability Insurance and to comply with all Health and Safety Regulations in force at the time of the Match. Competitors must have with them their own copy certificate of Insurance and must be able to produce it on the match day if required.

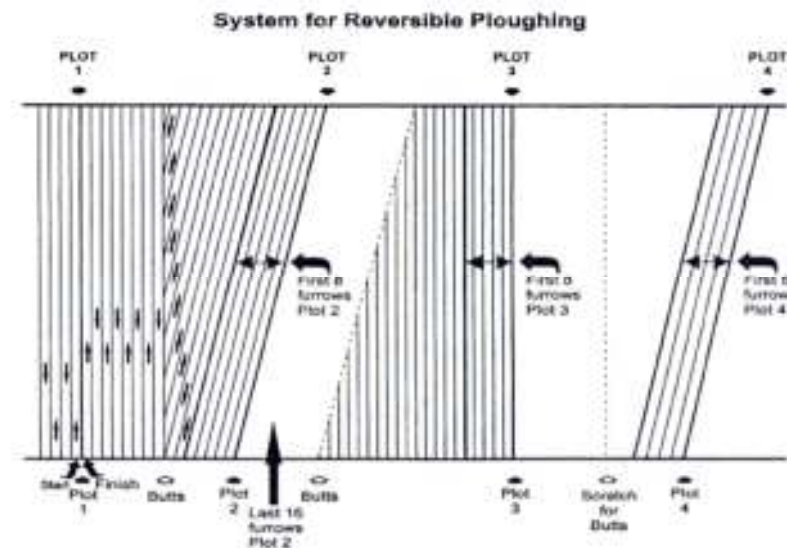
Competitors in CLASS 4P will be expected to plough their respective plots as per the National System for Reversible Ploughing (illustrated) and if requested any competitor will be sent a larger and more detailed plan following the closing date for entries.

Classes 5P, 6P & 11P will be scored as One Way points less butts.

ALL ONE-WAYS TO MAKE SINGLE SPLIT

THE SOCIETY IS AFFILIATED TO THE SOCIETY OF PLOUGHMEN, and the judging of these Classes will be made on the NATIONAL POINTS SYSTEM. Where practical judging will be carried out from both ends, as practised by the Society of Ploughmen.

Competitors who have not finished their first three rounds by 10.30am will be disqualified

CLASSES TO FINISH AT 1pm

All ploughing is to be completed in the time allowed, although further time may be allowed with the Chief Steward's permission to compensate for time lost during the judging of opening splits.

Rig setting, trying out of ploughs etc., on headland or spare pieces of ground will NOT be allowed. The Stewards have power to disqualify any competitor breaking this rule.

All opening splits where applicable must be left open for inspection by the Judges/Stewards, who will then give permission to continue.

Competitors after having completed their crown, i.e. 6-8 furrows either side of the opening split, will then plough to the higher number, with one-way ploughs to use alternate bodies.

TROPHIES

The Champion will also receive **THE SOCIETY'S TANKARD**.

NOTICE TO ALL TRADE STAND OWNERS, COMPETITORS, CONTRACTORS AND EXHIBITORS

Third Party Liability Insurance must be carried by all Trade Stand Owners, Competitors, Contractors and Exhibitors.

All ploughing and hedge-cutting matches are under increasing pressure from the Health & Safety Executive to improve safety standards.

To minimise risks, especially where there are animals and machinery, the numbers of vehicles must be kept to a minimum.

For this reason, the Society's Committee has decided that:

1. From the Monday of Match week, no vehicle will be allowed onto the Site without an appropriate pass.
2. Vehicles must park as directed by the Stewards.
3. Vehicles not authorised to remain on the Site must be removed by 9.00 a.m. on Match day and Trade/Craft Exhibitors must not move vehicles onto the Site before 5.00 p.m. without express permission of the Society's Secretary.
4. Additional cars will not be allowed to accompany animal or other transporters onto the Site without the prior consent of the Secretary.
5. Caravans, unless an integral part of a Trade Stand, are not allowed on the Site.
6. A speed limit of 5 mph will be in force at all times during the establishment, operations and clearing of the Site.
7. Vehicles will not be allowed to move on the Site unless adequately stewarded, and only then when moving to display areas for exhibition. Only adults should operate or ride on any machinery. All precautions must be in place to protect bystanders.

Any Exhibitor, Competitor, Standholder, or other person who fails to comply with instructions of an appointed Match official will be immediately disqualified from taking any further part in the proceedings and will be ordered to leave the Site forthwith.

**SMOKING in cooking areas and Marquees is NOT PERMITTED nor is it permitted to smoke in close proximity to straw whether baled or loose, wood shavings or any other combustible material.
No cooking demonstrations in Craft Marquee.**

Code of Practice for Safety and Accident Prevention (Health & Safety at Work Act 1974)

Match Site; Sapperton Manor, Church Broughton, Derbyshire, DE65 5AU

The requirements of this Code of Practice apply to all persons using the Site, be they Exhibitors, Trade Exhibitors, Contractors, or others. The Society will appoint a Safety Officer, who together with the stewards in the various sections will be empowered to take whatever action is considered necessary in the event of any infringement of any regulations. All Society stewards will pay particular attention to all aspects of Health and Safety to see that they are complied with throughout the Match. Competent people will be appointed to assist the Society in meeting its statutory duties, including if deemed necessary, specialists from outside organisations. Certain visitors to the Match may not be familiar with the sort of machinery, equipment and animals they are likely to come into contact on the Site and extra care and vigilance will be required. This Code is not exhaustive in its coverage of specified equipment or situations, because of the nature of the Match. Clearly, by their very nature, certain exhibits will require more rigorous attention to Health and Safety matters. Every Exhibitor, Contractor, or other person must co-operate with the Society to enable all statutory duties to be complied with. Each has a legal obligation to take reasonable care for his or her own health and safety and for the safety of other people who may be affected by his or her acts or omissions. The successful implementation of this Code of Practice requires total commitment from everyone and your co-operation is requested throughout your time on the Site.

1 TRADE AND EXHIBITIONS & CRAFT

- (a) CONTROL OF SUBSTANCES HAZARDOUS TO HEALTH REGULATIONS 2002 (COSHH)
Exhibitors or others who bring any hazardous substances to the Site *MUST* assess the risks and initiate suitable control measures in accordance with the above regulations.
- (b) TRACTORS, MOTOR VEHICLES AND OTHER SELF PROPELLED IMPLEMENTS
These and all other vehicles must be immobilised when not in use. In addition, battery leads should always be disconnected.
- (c) POWER TOOLS AND CHAIN SAWS
Demonstrations must take place behind a suitable barrier.
All Competitors, Contractors and Exhibitors must fulfil their responsibilities under the relevant current Health & Safety Legislation where the use of Power Tools and Chain Saws is concerned in connection with their activities on the Site. By entering the Match each person is taken to confirm that he is appropriately qualified and has all (if any) necessary authorisations, qualifications and/or certificates to use such equipment at the Match.
- (d) MARQUEES
All marquees must be of a secure and stable structure. Special attention must be paid to entry and exit points. These must not be obstructed at any time.
- (e) No cooking in craft marquee.
- (f) FLAG POLES AND HIGH SIGNS
These must be securely installed and be of adequate strength, taking into account wind and other

stresses and avoid overhead cables.

- (f) STATIC GENERATORS
There must be no straw or other combustible material placed around static generators.
- (g) ELECTRICITY
Exhibitors, Trade Stand Holders and others must conform to regulations laid down by the Health & Safety Executive.
Persons using Calor Gas must also comply with Health & Safety Regulations. They must be aware of and comply with Health & Safety Notice C.S.6.

2 LIVESTOCK

- (a) CATTLE
Exhibitors must use suitable equipment when handling cattle and ensure that handlers are mature and experienced in cattle handling and familiar with HSE Guidance on showing cattle so far as relevant to the Match.
During the period that the Match is open to the public, cattle should not be left unattended and all animals should be safely secured at all times.
Cattle on stands or forming part of a display must be penned and comply with any veterinary department movement regulations in force.
- (b) HORSES
Exhibitors must comply with rules and guidance notes laid down by their controlling bodies and the rules of the Society.
- (c) PARADES AND JUDGING
All animals moving from lines to judging areas or rings, and returning after judging, must follow designated routes as directed by the Society's stewards.
- (d) DOGS
All dogs must be on a short lead. Long leads are not permitted on the Site.

3 MISCELLANEOUS

- (a) FOOD SAFETY
All persons supplying food to the public should be adequately trained in Hygiene and Food Safety. No dogs other than assistance dogs allowed in the food marquees.
- (b) NO SMOKING IN COOKING AREAS/MARQUEES
Smoking in cooking areas and Marquees is not permitted nor is it permitted to smoke in close proximity to straw whether baled or loose, wood shavings or any other combustible material.
- (c) DISPLAYS
Particular attention is drawn to the safety aspect of displays on the Site. These will be restricted to the designated areas on the Site. The perimeter of all displays will be clearly marked.
Under no circumstances should a member of the public enter a display area. Particular care must be taken to ensure that children do not either climb over or under rails or ropes to obtain a better view or must they be allowed to sit on any rails or fencing.
- (d) OTHER DISPLAYS OR ACTIVITIES
Each such activity should have a responsible and competent person in charge of safety and precautions are to be taken at all times.
- (e) ACCIDENT PROCEDURE
Any injury to any person must be reported to the Secretary or the chief steward for that section of the Match as soon as possible. An easily accessible First Aid Post will be provided.
